Colonoscopy Preparation Instructions

Miralax-Gatorade (PEG 3350-Sports Drink)



Mount Sinai

Materials Needed

- 1 bottle of Miralax (or Glycolax) (238 g)
- 2 32-oz bottles of sports drink (Powerade, Gatorade, sugar-free Powerade/Gatorade, Crystal Light, iced tea)
- Do NOT purchase red or purple drinks
- 2 4.5 oz saline enema laxatives (optional)

General Instructions

- Proper preparation with laxative solutions is needed to clean colon so that it can be fully visualized (instructions below)
- Arrive 1 hour prior to procedure (addresses at end of pamphlet)
- Bring photo identification and insurance card (if applicable)
- Leave all valuables at home
- <u>An adult 18 years or older must be</u> present to take you home after the procedure. Procedure will be canceled if a companion is not available.
- Call 212-659-8770 at least 48 hours in advance to cancel procedure

Medications

- Consult doctor for further instructions if you take any of the following blood thinning or antiplatelet medications:
 - Coumadin (warfarin)
 - Lovenox (heparin)
 - Plavix (clopidogrel)
 - Pradaxa (dabigatran)
 - Eliquis (apixaban)
 - Effient (prasugrel)
 - Xarelto (rivaroxaban)
 - Savaysa (edoxaban)
- Bring list of current medications to procedure
- If you have diabetes, please see end of pamphlet for additional instructions

1 week before:

- Discontinue the following:
 - Fiber supplements
 - Iron-containing medications
 - Multivitamins

1 day before:

DIET

- Eat a low fiber breakfast (ex. white bread, white rice, eggs, cheese, milk)
- Drink only clear liquids after breakfast
- Avoid red or purple-colored drinks, jello, or popsicles and diary after breakfast
- Examples of acceptable liquids: clear broths (chicken, vegetable, beef consomme), apple juice, limeade, white grape juice, tea/coffee WITHOUT milk or cream, soda, Gatorade, water, jello (no red or purple), Italian ice, popsicles

PREP INSTRUCTIONS

• Mix and stir the 238 gram bottle of Miralax with 64 oz of sports drink in a large pitcher (may add ice)

6 PM on the day before:

- Goal: Drink ½ of the mixture
- Drink 18-oz glass of the mixture every 10-15 minutes until you have finished ½ of the mixture

EXPECTATIONS

• You will start to have more frequent bowel movements (5-10 times) after 30-60 minutes • Bloating or cramping may occur and will improve after passing stool

6 hours before procedure:

• Finish remaining ½ of Miralax mixture within a time period of 30-60 minutes

EXPECTATIONS

- You will start to have more bowel movements within 30-60 minutes (10-15 times)
- Stool should become clear and yellow fluid
- If stool is not clear, drink an additional 1 L of water or clear fluid 3.5 hours prior to procedure (if preparation is not adequate, physician may not be able to visualize entire colon)
- If there are still stool particles present, you can self-administer 1 or 2 4.5 oz saline enema laxatives (available over the counter in pharmacies)

3 hours before:

- Discontinue all fluids
- Take any necessary medication with small sip of water unless otherwise instructed (consult with physician if you have diabetes or take aspirin)

1 hour before:

• Arrive at procedure location

What is a colonoscopy?

- Visual examination of large intestine with a colonoscope (long, flexible instrument with light and camera) that is passed through rectum and colon
- Physician will look for any abnormalities
- Can evaluate and treat colon cancer, polyps, gastrointestinal bleeding, and diarrhea
- Biopsies can be taken for analysis

What should I expect during the procedure?

- 1. Doctor and/or nurse will explain procedure and answer questions and you will sign consent form
- 2. Meet with anesthesiologist who will sedate you during procedure and monitor your vitals
- 3. You will change into hospital gown and remove eyeglasses and contact lenses
- 4. You will be taken to procedure room where you will be given medication to be relaxed and sleepy
- 5. Colonoscope will be passed through rectum and colon. This will take 15-60 minutes. Any biopsies will be taken at this time.
- 6. You may experience abdominal cramping and pressure during procedure and may be asked to change position during the procedure

What happens after the procedure?

- You will be in a recovery area for 30 minutes while the sedation wears off
- Physician will discuss results and follow-up plans and you will be given discharge instructions
- COMPANION MUST BE PRESENT TO ACCOMPANY YOU HOME. Do not drive a car, operate machinery, or make important decisions for remainder of day as the sedation will impair your reflexes and judgment

What are the risks?

- Complications are rare (< 1/1000)
- Possible complications: reactions to medication, tearing of the intestine and bleeding
- Risks are slightly increased if polyp removal is necessary
- Inform us immediately if you have severe pain, black tarry stools, or persistent bleeding, or fevers/chills in the hours or days after colonoscopy

Inform doctor if:

- Have allergies or reactions to medications
- Take antibiotics for dental procedures
- Are taking aspirin, arthritis medicines, or blood thinners
- Have a blood disorder where you bleed easily
- Think you may be pregnant

Additional Medication Instructions For Patients with Diabetes:

- If you take long-acting insulin (Glargine/Lantus):
 - Take ½ of normal dose day before colonoscopy
 - If blood glucose day of procedure is <150 mg/dL, do NOT take insulin
 - If blood glucose day of procedure is >150 mg/dL, take ½ of prescribed dose
- If you take short-acting insulin (Lispro/Humalog):
 - Take ½ of normal daily dose day before colonoscopy
 - Do NOT take insulin day of procedure
- If you take oral diabetes medications:
 - Metformin: Continue as normal until the day before procedure. Do not take morning of procedure.
 - Empagliflozin (Jardiance), canagliflozin (Invokana): STOP take 3 days prior to procedure. Resume after procedure.
 - Trulicity and Ozempic: Do NOT take in the 7 days before the procedure.
